Beta definition:

Beta provides a measure of a stock or fund's volatility relative to the market. The market is often defined by a certain benchmark, index or market average. The market's beta is 1. If a stock or fund is more volatile than the market, its beta will be higher than 1. If it is less volatile, the beta will be below 1.
